Peregrination of the Triptych

God's Providence watches over us and allows us to live a great and important moments in the Church, in the parish, in the family and our lives. The year 2020 is the year of the Great Jubilee, exactly on May 18th, there will be the 100th anniversary of the birth of Great John Paul II. In order to prepare spiritually for the celebration of this anniversary at the Chapters of the John Paul II Foundation, peregrination of the Triptych (with the icon of Our Lady of Częstochowa and images of St. John Paul II and Saint Faustina) started. John Paul II entirely entrusted himself and the whole world to the Mother of Christ reflecting this in his motto *Totus Tuus* – all Yours. The Pope entrusted to Virgin Mary all aspects of our reality, aspects big and small. In his speeches, letters or encyclicals, referring to various issues, he always entrusted them to Mary. At the same time pointing to the Mother of the Church as a model to follow. He emphasized that the word “consecration” specifies a special partnership relationship that occurs as a result of the response to love.

Through the peregrination of the Triptych, following St. John Paul II, we want to entrust to the Mother of God: ourselves, our families, the work of the Foundation and the Church, and the whole world, which

now, as never before, needs God's Mercy.

Peregrination of the Triptych will be done on three continents: America, Asia, and Europe. On the American continent it already started on August 17, 2019 in Webster, in the St. Joseph Basilica. After the commemorate entrance during which the Triptych was carried by Małgorzata and Krzysztof Kacprzak, and welcome words delivered by the Pastor of the Basilica, Grzegorz Chodkowski, a solemn Mass was celebrated. During the Mass, Prelate Antoni Czarnecki delivered the homily. The solemn Mass ended with a prayer for the St. John Paul II intercession. After the Mass, faithful paid homage to relics which are peregrinating along with the Triptych.

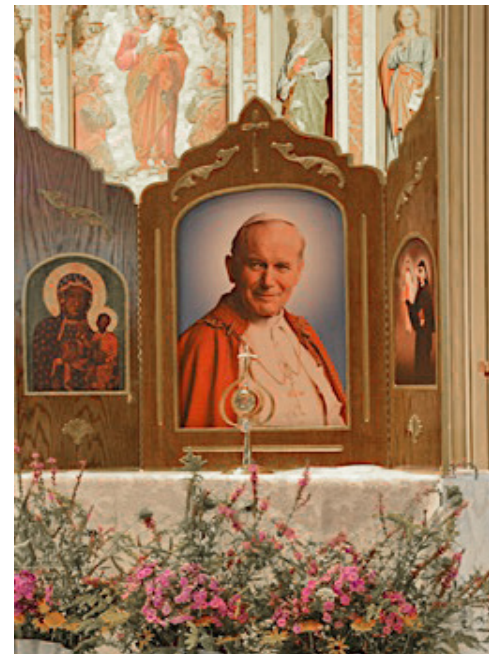
The Triptych stayed at the St. Joseph Basilica in Webster until Saturday, August 24th. During that time, faithful will be able to participate in the daily Mass, Novena to St. John Paul II and prayerful vigil. On Wednesday, August 21st, a special devotion to Our Lady of Jasna Góra (Częstochowa), St John Paul II and St. Faustina took place.

The Triptych was taken from St. Joseph Basilica in Webster to Worcester, MA to the Our Lady of Częstochowa Church.

Now, the second Triptych is pere-

grinating in Europe. On August 26, 2019 in the Chapel of Our Lady of Jasna Góra, the Triptych was blessed and given to dr. Fr. Stanisław Pławecki, CSsR, the priest who served in Germany. The Triptych will be passed to Fr. Pławecki, CSsR. The peregrination was started on October 12th at the Polish Church in Munich.

The peregrination of the third Triptych will start in Jakarta in May 2020 during the meeting of Youth of Indonesia.





Silver Jubilee of the John Paul II Foundation Home in Lublin

The 25th anniversary of the John Paul II Foundation Home in Lublin began with the holy Mass celebrated by Cardinal Stanisław Dziwisz, who had a longstanding governing authority over the Foundation. Archbishop of Lublin, Stanisław Budzik; Archbishop Józef Kowalczyk – Primate Senior; Bishop Artur Miziński – Secretary General of KEP; Ryszard Karpiński – Auxiliary Bishop of Lublin Diocese; Józef Staniewski – Auxiliary Bishop Diocese of Grodno; Fr. Prof. Andrzej Kiciński – Vice-Rector of KUL; Fr. Prof. Stanisław Wilk-Former Rector of KUL; Fr. Wiesław Święch – Provincial Superior of the Sacred Heart Priests; Fr. Prof. Marian Radwan – Sacred Heart Priest; founder of the Foundation scholarship program; Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko-Administrator of the John Paul II Foundation in Rome; Prelate Stefan Wylężek – Rector of the Polish Catholic Mission in England and Wales; Fr. Jan Strzałka – Director of the Foundation Home along with other priests also celebrated the Mass. Many students and guests participated in the Mass as well.

In the jubilee celebrations participated also: Prof. Agnieszka Lekka Kowalik – Director of the John Paul II Institute, KUL; Ewa Bednarkiewicz - President of the Warsaw Chapter of the Foundation, Henryk Sala – Member of the Administrative council of the Foundation; nuns, architects and builders of the Foundation's Home, former and current employees, alumni and current scholarship recipients.

In his homily Cardinal Dziwisz empathized that John Paul II took over to Rome from Cracow and Lublin the experience of friendship with young people. "The Pope impressed young people with his authenticity of life and service, with setting up his expectation toward young people very high as he even had greater demands from himself"

Then, in the homily, the Cardinal gave his personal testimony: „John Paul II was grateful to the God's for the great changes that occurred in our countries and in front of our eyes in the late 1980s and 1990s of the last century. At the same time, he was thinking about the future. He knew that after gaining freedom and sovereignty, our countries would need talented and competent young

Christians who, after completing their education, will engage in religious, professional, social and political life in their homelands.

From this vision-he continued - in 1990, the scholarship program for young people was created. Prof. Fr. Marian Radwan contributed a lot in that case. Earlier, he learned about the situation of the Church in the East, saw the problem and the opportunities of educating young people and signaled that to the Holy Father. And, the Holy Father was very generous as he was deeply convinced of the validity and the saving fruits of this initiative. I give this testimony as I also participated in some part in this good work. For the realization of this initiative, there was an idea of building the John Paul II Foundation Home in Lublin.

After the holy Mass, the Cardinal presented to the Foundation's Home a beautiful painting with the image of Mother of God.

Then, participants of the jubilee celebrations went to the Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński's hall at KUL, where the occasional academy took place. The academy started the choir of the stipend recipients of the JP II Foundation. Welcome words were delivered by with the Rector of the Catholic University of Lublin (KUL) Prof. Dr Hab. Antoni Dębiński, who also presented medals minted on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of KUL to Prof. Fr. Marian Radwan and Ewa Bed-

narkiewicz, President of the Chapter. Prof Fr. M. Radwan expressed their gratitude for the medals that they received and described how the Foundation's scholarship program started. Then, the following people delivered speeches: Fr. Jan Strzałka, Mrs. Ewa Bednarkiewicz, Fr. Wiesław Święch, Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, Fr. Stefan Wylężek. On behalf of former scholarship recipients, spoke: Bishop Józef Staniewski from Belarus, Fr. Andriy Delisandru from Ukraine and Prof. Bronisław Kluska from Slovakia.

Final speech delivered, Archbishop of Lublin, Stanisław Budzik, Great Chancellor of KUL. He expressed gratitude for the great work of the John Paul II Foundation and made wishes of God's blessing and intercession of St. John Paul II to God for the continuous success of the Foundation.

The academy was enriched with a with a beautiful singing of the Foundation's scholarships recipients and alumni: Alesia Aleksandrowicz, Tatsiana Ivashkevich, Anna Prosieková, Dzymitr Harelau, Maxim Bevskyi.

The jubilee celebrations ended with a concert at the Lublin Cathedral, which featured: the choir and the ensemble of brass instruments of the John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin and the Chamber Orchestra „Sinfonia Concertante” from Warsaw.

New Church dedicated to St. John Paul II in Surabaya

On September 29, 2019 in Surabaya, Indonesia, blessing of the St. John Paul II Church and opening of the museum dedicated to the great Pope took place. Bishop Vincentius Sutikno Wisaksono, from the Surabaya diocese along with Archbishop Petrus Turang, Bishop Petrus C. Mandagi and Bishop Silvester Tung Kiem San blessed and consecrated the Church. Many priests, nuns, representatives of the government and a lot of faithful people participated in the ceremony. The John Paul II Foundation was represented by Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, Administrator of the Foundation who accepted the invitation from Mrs. Melinda Tedja. The Church and the museum were designed by Alex Bayusaputro, famous architect from Singapore. It is the first Church in the Indonesia which was built in the mall (shopping center). The leading thought behind creating a Church in the shopping center was to provide a chance to participate in the Mass and to meet and learn about the Saint Pope. John Paul II visited Indonesia in 1989. From that pilgrimage, Mrs. Melinda Tedja remembers the great smile and enormous goodness of the Pope. Subsequent visits and meeting with John

Paul II at the Vatican touched a lot Melinda and Alexander. Thus, they got this idea to build a Church dedicated to St. John Paul II and to create a museum of this great Pope. This was an expression of gratitude from Mrs. Melinda and a way of passing to the next generations the message of total entrustment to God and sacrifice to the other man. The statue of St. John Paul II was made in Poland and placed in the sanctuary of the Church. All memorabilia located in the museum were provided from the private collection of Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko, Chairman of the Administrative

Board of the John Paul II Foundation, as well as from the archives of the Foundation Secretariat. The relics of the blood of Pope John Paul II were given by Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko and placed in a special reliquary located in the sanctuary of the Church. A local priest of the Diocese of Surabaya was appointed as the curator of the Church – St. John Paul II Sanctuary. For this celebration, special billboards informing about this great event were prepared and located in various parts and regions of the city. On a daily basis, around thousand people visit the Church.



Banquet in honor of Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio Papal Medal for Mieczysław Pająk

Tradition of the John Paul II Foundation Chapter in New York is to organize an annual banquet, during which one spiritual leader merited for Poland and the John Paul II Foundation is distinguished. This year, during the banquet that took place on June 2, 2019 at Princess Manor in Greenpoint, Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio was our Guest of Honor. This date was special as the date exactly happened on the 40th anniversary of the first pilgrimage of John Paul II to Poland, the fact that was mentioned several times during the banquet

to stress the historic importance of that event. The Guest of Honor received from the John Paul II Foundation Chapter in New York a portrait of Pope John Paul II. Giving thanks for the distinction, Bishop DiMarzio recalled some events from history. He stressed the gratitude which Italians have to Poles for the battle of Monte Cassino. Bishop DiMarzio also recalled his meetings with the Holy Father John Paul II, who appointed him as the bishop. He also mentioned a longstanding friendship with Prelate Piotr Żendzian.

Bishop DiMarzio stated that the Diocese of Brooklyn has more than 100 thousand Poles, for whom Masses are celebrated in Polish language in more than 20 parishes. During the banquet, the President of the New York Chapter, Mieczysław Pająk, received the Papal medal PRO ECCLESIA ET PONTIFICE (for Church and Pope) awarded by the Holy Father Francis. Bishop Witold Mroziowski presenting the medal along with the congratulation letter, said: "Honoring His Excellency, Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio, on behalf of



the John Paul II Foundation in Rome, through hands of Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko and Father Krzysztof Wieliczko, we would like to present this medal, which the Holy Father grants for special work and dedication to the Church and for the Pope. The award is presented to Mr. Mieczysław Pająk.” The presentation of the medal was a very nice surprise for the President of the Chapter and guests. Mieczysław Pająk leads the New York Chapter for 22 years and is one of the co-founders of the Chapter.

The music was provided by ‘The Masters’ band. Jakub Staniewski was the announcer. Numerous friends of the John Paul II Foundation, representatives of the Polish Saturday Schools, approximately 40 priests from various Polish parishes together with parishioners, Polonia’s organizations: Pulaski Association of Business and Professional Men, representatives of the Polish

American Congress, representatives of the Polish & Slavic Federal Credit Union, and of the Polish-Slavic Center participated in the banquet. This year’s banquet provided a lot of nice and touching moments among friends. We would like to express our congratulations to Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio and Mieczysław Pająk wishing them God’s graces and St. John Paul II patronage.

New candidates

On Monday, July 1st, started the preparatory and qualifying course of the scholarship program of the John Paul II Foundation in Lublin. To participate in the course, 32 young people from Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Russia and Ukraine were invited.

The preparatory course includes classes from Polish language and from major subjects. Professors of the Catholic University of Lublin and the Lublin University of Technology are teaching the classes. On the daily basis, young people are actively participating in the Mass, preparing the readings, the prayer of the faithful and singing.

Sightseeing of Lublin, as well as a visit to the former German Nazi Concentration and Extermination Camp (1941-1944) at Majdanek is included in the program of the preparatory course.

At the end of the course, the qualification commission will decide who will receive the scholarship award that will allow participating in the formation program and studying at the Catholic University of Lublin.

Celebrations of St. Francis of Assisi in Malesia

On September 28, 2019 in Selangor, in the suburbs of the big city Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in the St. Francis of Assisi Church, a Novena prayer was ongoing for nine days. The prayers were preparing the parish for the celebrations related to the Founder of the Franciscan Order. The Novena prayer ended on October 6th with a solemn Mass celebrated by most Rev. Julian Leow Beng Kim.

The John Paul II Foundation Administrator, Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, from Vatican, was invited to lead the last days of the Novena. On the fifth day of the Novena prayers, Fr. Wieliczko at 6:30 p.m. led the Holy Hour and Rosary prayers. While, at 8 p.m., he celebrated a Holy Mass during which he delivered a homily “Strategically aim you Family in the right direction.” On the sixth day of

the Novena, Fr. Andrew along with the faithful led the meditations – Transitus (last moment of St. Francis’ life), while Fr. Wieliczko along with other priests celebrated the Holy Mass. In the homily, Fr. Wieliczko encouraged faithful to give love and attention to children: „as your kids grow, pay attention to how they are developing spiritually, mentally, physically and emotionally”.

On the seventh day, during which the liturgical remembrance of St. Francis of Assisi was celebrated, was very special. At 10 a.m. Fr. Wieliczko celebrated a Holy Mass and delivered the homily to the sick people. After the Mass, each sick person was blessed individually with the Blessed Sacrament. It was a special moment of prayers and entrust to the Eucharistic Jesus. The blessing was followed by veneration of the Relic

of St. Francis of Assisi and St. John Paul II. In the evening, at 6:30 p.m., there was adoration of the Blessed Sacrament followed by the Novena to St. Francis. A solemn Holy Mass was celebrated at 8 p.m. After the Mass, there faithful participated in the procession with the Franciscan Rosary. On the eight day of the Novena, at 8:30 a.m. there were Holy Hours and Benediction prayers. Then, at 9:30 a.m., there was veneration of the Relic of St. Francis of Assisi and at 10 a.m. a multilingual Mass was celebrated. On the ninth day, most Rev. Julian Leow Beng Kim celebrated a Holy Mass which ended with plenary indulgence. The Novena and celebrations of the St. Francis of Assisi feast ended with a lunch for which all faithful were invited.

125th Anniversary, Webster, MA

On May 17 -20, 2019, Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko along with Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko at the invitation of Prelate Antoni Czarnecki visited Webster, MA. The 99th anniversary of the birth of St. John Paul II and the 125th anniversary of the Parish school and the inauguration of the new sport facilities and gymnasium was the reason of the visit.

On May 19th during the solemn thanksgiving Mass, Cardinal Ryłko congratulated all and especially Prelate Czarnecki this beautiful initiative of creating new sport facilities and gymnasium, which is a sign of parishioners’ generosity and commitment in the education of the younger

generation. In the afternoon, there was a meeting of the presidents of the Foundation’s Chapters from Canada, USA and Indonesia. At first, Ms. Barbara Pyśk, president of the John Paul II Foundation New England Chapter welcomed all guests: Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko, Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, Administrator of the Foundation and the Chapter’s Presidents: Lucy Lian-do from Indonesia, Barbara Popielak from Colorado, Bogusława Doerr from Southern California, Mieczysław Boks from New Jersey, Anthony Togliatti and Fr. Erik Orzech from Ohio, Ryszard Krzyżanowski from Philadelphia, Cecylia and Raymond Glembocki from Washington, Wie-

śława Chrapka from Toronto, Stefan Władysiuk from Montreal. The Chapter presidents gave an update from the actives of the Chapter.

On May 18, 2019 the celebrations of the 99th anniversary of the Great Saint John Paul II took place. During the solemn Mass, Cardinal Ryłko presented the remarkable Pope, who put a deep mark on the life of the Church and the world. At the end of the celebrations, Vespers were sung in Latin language at that Basilica. After the blessing, all were invited to a banquet. Beside the distinguished guest, Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko, many priests and nuns as well as multiple guests participated in the celebrations.





Papal Day in Munich



The Papal Day is the main celebration of the year for which the Munich Chapter of the John Paul II Foundation prepares with a great attention. The 19th Papal Day was celebrated with the motto: “Rise, and let’s go.” That day went by at our parish in a special atmosphere of homage and thanksgiving for the gift of this extraordinary pontificate of the Polish Pope. On Friday preceding the Papal Day that is on October 11th the peregrination of the Triptych with the images of Our Lady of Częstochowa, St. John Paul II, and St. Faustina Kowalska started. Novena, which will be prayed at the Polish Catholic parish in the Bavarian capital will continue

until October 19th, initiated the peregrination of the Triptych in Europe. At the invitation of the Pastor of the Church and the Chaplain of our Chapter, Fr. Stanisław Plawecki, from Rome came Prelate Sławomir Nasiorowski, who for 18 years works for the Polish section of the Secretariat of State of the Holy See. The guest honored with his presence our Saturday meeting of members of the Munich Chapter. The President of the Chapter, Ms. Marta Czempik presented forms of activities of the Munich Chapter. In his lecture, Fr. Nasiorowski shared his personal experiences from the times when he was near the Pope, living at the Vatican and accompanying him in many foreign pilgrims. In his testimony he confessed that the holiness of Karol Wojtyła was felt during meetings with him, listening to his homilies, and above all, by seeing him deep in prayers. Fr. Monsignor asked members of the Chapter to continue to support the Foundation with prayers and financially, but above all, by spreading the legacy of

John Paul II and referring to his teaching which is so applicable to current times. After the meeting which ended with agape, members of the Chapters went to the Church to participate in the Mass and to pray in front of the Triptych. On Sunday, during the Holy Mass, the Prelate shared with the Poles his memories of John Paul II, emphasizing the holiness, and at the same time, the greatness of the Pope—a good-natured man, sincere and open to his neighbor. Members of the Chapter were collecting donations for the John Paul II Foundation. We, members of the Chapter, feel called again to act in accordance with the motto of the Papal Day, “Rise up and let’s go.” Let us not hesitate, let us give testimonies and try to be good Christians by looking at St. John Paul II. We are already looking forward to a trip to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the birth date of our beloved Holy Father that will take place in Rome in April 2020.

1st anniversary of the death of Archbishop Szczepan Wesoły

On August 28, 2018, Archbishop Szczepan Wesoły died in Rome at the age of 92. He was tireless guardian and shepherd of Polonia around the world, devoted patriot and son of the upper Silesian land. He was beloved shepherd of Poles in exile and a close associate of John Paul II.

For many years, he was a Chairman of the Administrative Council of the John Paul II Foundation. He contributed to dissemination and learning of John Paul II teachings in the places where the John Paul II Foundation Chapters are active. For his service among emigrants, he received multiple awards: Order of the White Eagle, Doctor Honoris Causa of the John Paul II Catholic University of Lublin and the University of Silesia, the Order of Polonia Restituta, the Golden Laurel of Polonia, and Lux Ex Silesia.

He was also an honorary citizen of Katowice.

In accordance with his last wish, his body was placed in the crypt of the Cathedral of Christ the King in Katowice.

Remembering the late archbishop Szczepan Wesoły, bishop Lechowicz in his homily emphasized that he derived from the relationship with Christ “motivation and wisdom to establish relationships with others”. He said that archbishop Wesoły “treated all Poles living outside the borders of his native country as his own family”, “he was interested in everyone life, he knew both lay and clergy by name. He talked about them with love and passion, and they responded with similar feelings, talking about archbishop Wesoły as “our bishop.” It was mutual love, true friendship”, he said.

After the last holy Mass of the evening, the Basilica closes its doors. There is silence taking over the space; darkness invites the faithful to prayer and meditation. Only the Blessed Sacrament, the altar and the pulpit remain illuminated. In the presbytery on the dome of the ceiling there is a magnificent representation of Christ, dressed in white with open arms, who wants all people near Him. The impressive silence is filled with prayers, invites faithful to dialogue with the Son of God. His genial,

yet at the same time penetrating eyes – yes, it is a meeting. We can present to Him everything: sorrows, wounds, but also our joys. He not only takes it, but in His infinite mercy, He will always be present in our lives.

The following day, Friday, March 15th was a time of meditations with Fr. Stefan Wylężek, who invited us to contemplate the Gospel according to St. Matthew with the parable about the unforgiving debtor. Fr. Stefan explained to us the meaning of this parable. At 11:15 a.m., Fr. Stefan Wylężek celebrated a holy Mass and then, at noon, the noon prayer – Sexte – with beautiful songs of the Benedictine Sisters. After lunch, in a warm atmosphere we ended our prayer meeting looking forward to continue this beautiful initiative next year. At the very end, we gathered in the Basilica's „Chapel of St. John Paul II „, recalling his touching words: „Give your heart to the one who will open your heart „.

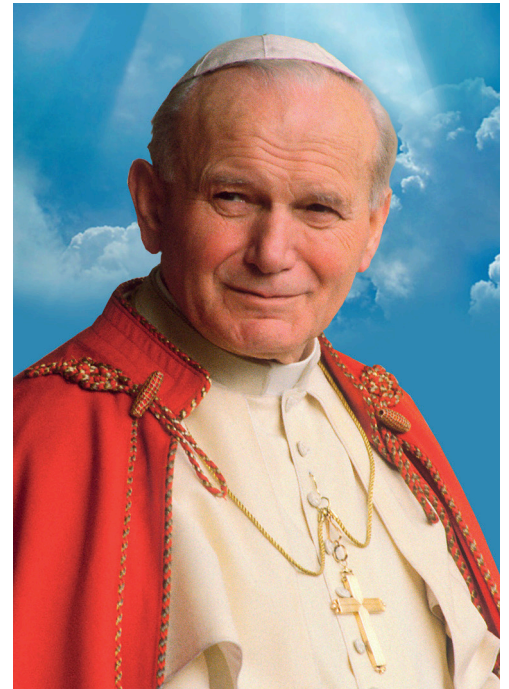
