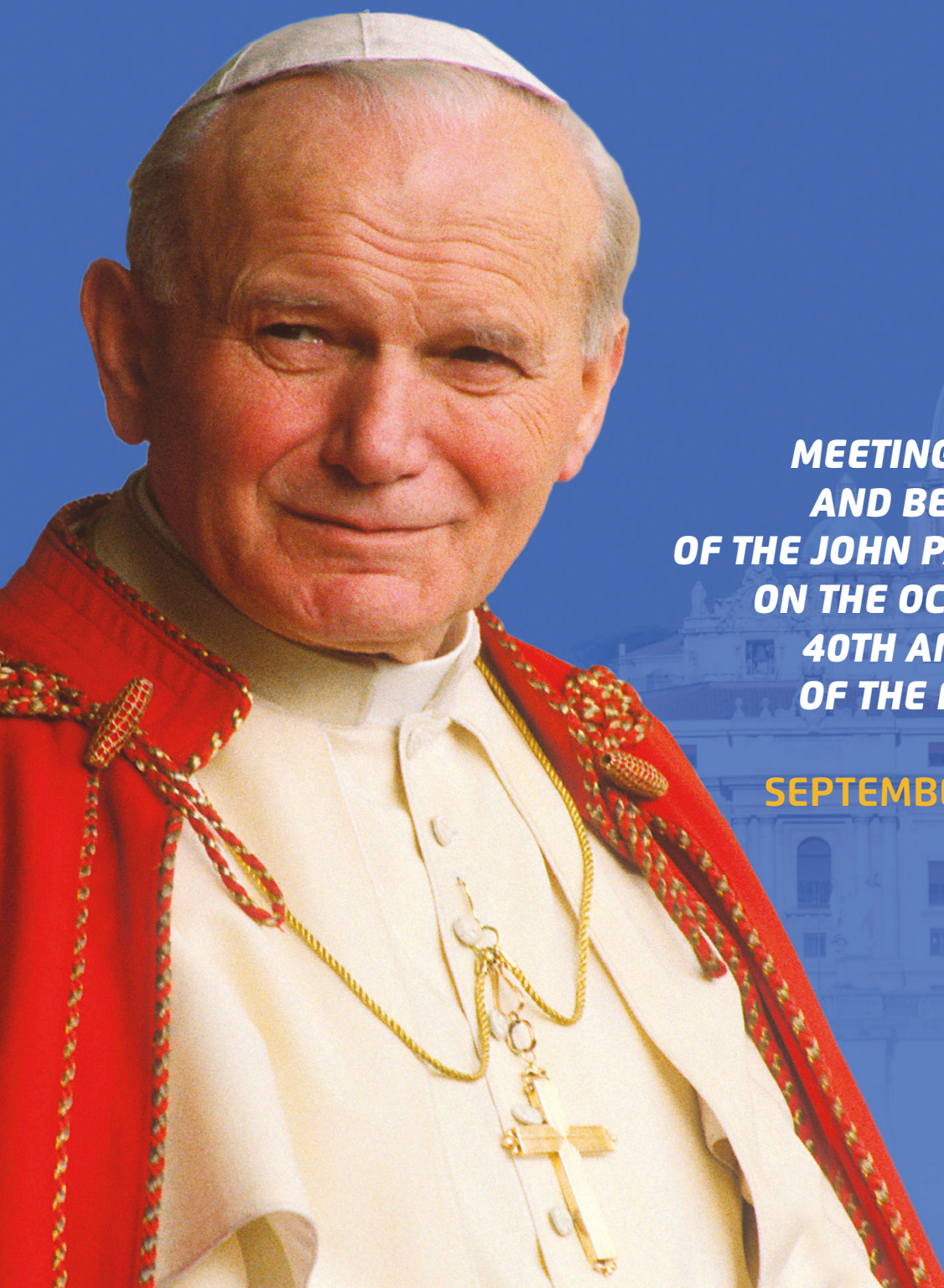

## 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEDICATION OF THE POLISH HOUSE ON VIA CASSIA BY POPE JOHN PAUL II



On Sunday, November 7, a solemn Mass was celebrated by Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko on the 40th anniversary of the blessing of the Polish House on Via Cassia by the Holy Father John Paul II. Together with Cardinal Ryłko Holy Mass celebrated: Rev. Łukasz Kotarba, director of the Polish Home. Fr. Krzysztof Wieliczko, administrator of the JP II Foundation, Fr. Robert Ptak, vice director of the JP II House in Lublin and invited priests from Rome. In the solemn Mass participated the Polish Ambassador to the Holy See Janusz Kotański and representatives from Germany and Poland and numerous Poles living in Italy. His Eminence Cardinal Ryłko, welcoming the participants, said: "We have gathered today in front of the Lord's altar in the chapel of the Polish House, to thank God in this Eucharist for the gift of this House, on the 40th anniversary of its inauguration by St. John Paul II. We wish to extend our prayer to all our countrymen scattered all over the world who made it possible to buy this House with their sacrifice and later presented it to the Holy Father; we thank God for those

who managed this House and the institutions located in it; thank you for all the good that has been done here for 40 years. It is truly a living statue of St. John Paul II in Rome, whose role – over the years – does not diminish but continues to grow". In the homily Cardinal Ryłko mentioned that exactly 40 years ago, John Paul II met at the special audience with representatives of the Polish diaspora to thank for the gift of the Polish House in Rome, purchased from the donations of Poles scattered around the world. He also quoted the Pope's words: "it is a gift of the hearts of many, a gift of Polish men and Polish women, a gift of friends from other nationalities who wanted to participate in this initiative". Then, Cardinal Ryłko mentioned that special committees were set up in 25 countries to buy the House, collecting the funds, which later turned into the JP II Foundation's Chapters which operate to this day. At the end, Cardinal Ryłko noted that "The Polish House and the John Paul II Foundation are closely related, and they can fulfill their mission thanks to the generosity of many countrymen

from around the world, as well as people of other nationalities, in whose life John Paul II played and still plays a big role, for example in Indonesia, Singapore, Mexico. Today, we express our gratitude to all of them and say: God bless you for every gift of your heart. On the 40th anniversary of the inauguration of this House, invoking the intercession of our great Patron, we look to the future with confidence that despite the constantly raging pandemic, hope always prevails, because there is no lack of good people ready to support the legacy of St. John Paul II". After the closing prayer, the letter of Cardinal Stanisław Dziwisz was read on the Jubilee of the 40th anniversary of the dedication of the Polish House on via Cassia 1200 in Rome. Father Krzysztof Wieliczko, administrator of the JP II Foundation thanked His Eminence Cardinal Ryłko for the celebrating of the Holy Mass and his homily, and to all priests, religious sisters and gathered participants for their presence and prayers. Fr. Wieliczko on behalf of Rev. Łukasz Kotarba invited all participants to the reception.



## PILGRIMAGE OF THE JOHN PAUL II FOUNDATION CHAPTERS TO AMERICAN CZESTOCHOWA

On October 30-31, 2021, members and friends of the John Paul II Foundation from the east coast of the United States participated in a pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown, Pennsylvania. The purpose of the meeting was to commemorate the 43rd anniversary of the election of Cardinal Karol Wojtyła as the successor of St. Peter, to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the birth of St. John Paul II (a year later, because all celebrations in 2020 were canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the establishment of the John Paul II Foundation. The meeting began on Saturday, October 30, with a solemn banquet attended by the presidents of the John Paul II Foundation Chapters: Mieczysław Pająk from New York, Mieczysław Boks from New Jersey, Barbara Pyśk from New England, Marianna Eckel from Washington, Ryszard Krzyżanowski from Philadelphia. People who have contributed to the development of the organization were also invited. This group included: Mary Witkowska-Flanagan, Teresa Romanowska, Cecilia and Raymond Glembocki (printed and promoted educational materials and programs of the heritage of St. John Paul II), Michael Blichasz and Monsignor Anthony Czarnecki, a distinguished member of the Administrative Board of the JP II Foundation. The meeting was honored by the presence of the bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn, Witold Mroziwski. The Provincial of the Pauline Order, Father Tadeusz Lizińczyk, was also present. The Polish-Slavic Federal Credit Union was represented by President Bogdan Chmielowski, who donated a check for the sum of five thousand dollars for the development of the John Paul II Foundation. Numerous members and supporters of the Foundation came. From Rome, the Administrator of the

John Paul II Foundation, Father Krzysztof Wieliczko, came to the meeting. Fr. Krzysztof gave to the participants of the meeting a blessing from the Holy Father Francis and read a letter from Cardinal Stanisław Ryłko, Chairman of the Administrative Council of the John Paul II Foundation. Cardinal Ryłko wrote in his letter, among other things: "Dear friends, the joy of the jubilee of the Great John Paul II has not yet had time to resound fully, and we are already entering the time of celebrating the anniversary of the John Paul II Foundation. It was created by the will of the Pope himself on October 16, 1981. The goals of the Foundation include: scholarship awards which supports students; the Center for Documentation and Pontificate of John Paul II which collects valuable materials and publications, the Pielgrzym Home on Via Cassia, which was also dedicated 40 years ago. Thanks to your generosity those goals can be carried for so many years. It is an expression of a sense of responsibility for the content of our Foundation and its fate. May this meeting on the east coast of the United States be a thanksgiving time for 40 years of our Foundation, and at the same time a request for the further blessing of Almighty God for the next years of development of this heritage that our founder John Paul II the Great left for us. I bless you from the heart." During the banquet, the "Fidelity to Legacy of Saint John Paul II" award was presented for dedicated and selfless activity for the Foundation. The award was presented to Mary Witkowska Flanagan from Washington D.C. She was the main secretary of the committee that collected money to fund the Polish Home in Rome at Via Cassia. The Home still serves pilgrims and is a place of documentation of the pontificate of St. John Paul II. Together with Władysław Zachariasiewicz, she founded the John Paul II Foundation Chapter

in Washington DC. Mary At the end of the banquet, Bishop Witold Mroziwski shared his reflections on the Foundation. He said that as a graduate of the Catholic University of Lublin, he had a chance to meet scholarship recipients of the John Paul II Foundation, who bore witness to their faith and are followed the path of their Catholic education. He added that supporting the education of young people at Catholic universities is very important. He has been personally associated with the New York Foundation Chapter for 25 years. He concluded: "I know what it means to be a member of the Foundation, to participate in its life. This life fills us with joy, gives us power and strength. It is good to be in the Foundation and it is good to be part of this Foundation." At the end of the meeting, Father Krzysztof Wieliczko blessed all the participants of the meeting and invited them to pray together in the Chapel of the Miraculous Image of Our Lady of Czestochowa. In front of the Miraculous Image the Jasna Góra Appeal was sung and then Bishop Witold Mroziwski blessed all participants. The meeting ended with a Holy Mass, which was celebrated in the Chapel of the Miraculous Image of Our Lady of Czestochowa in the intention of all friends of the Foundation. Bishop Witold Mroziwski together with Monsignor Anthony Czarnecki and Father Krzysztof Wieliczko celebrated the Holy Mass. May the commemoration of the 100th anniversary of his birth, the 43rd anniversary of the election of Cardinal Wojtyła to the See of Peter and the 40th anniversary of the establishment of the Foundation named after our Pope be filled with joyful service to others for the multiplication of God's glory for the benefit of all the faithful in the One, Holy, Universal and Apostolic Church."

## RELICS OF ST. JOHN PAUL II IN RADOMSKO THE INAUGURATION OF THE JP II FOUNDATION CHAPTER

On October 13, 2021 in the parish of St. Mary Magdalene in Radomsko a unique ceremony was held. Archbishop Wacław Depo, Metropolitan of Częstochowa, handed over the relics of St. John Paul II to the parish community. October 13 is not a random day; on Sunday, October 10, we celebrated another XXI Papal Day and October 13 in our parish is the day of solemn Fatima services, ending with a procession through the streets of the city. The day of October 16, 1978 we all remember; it is the day of the election of Cardinal Karol Wojtyła as Pope. On October 16, the John Paul II Foundation celebrates the 40th anniversary of its establishment by John Paul II; establishment of the Foundation that bears his name. In the parish of St. Mary Magdalene, we are blessed to have the relics of St. Joanna Beretta Molla and St. Zelia and Louis Martin. For many years, it has been our desire that in our parish the Pope of the family, St. John Paul II could be present in his relics. Piotr Hernoga, the parish priest, had great kindness to the idea of obtaining the relics. At the time of the introduction of the relics, the parish priest said: "We wanted to have another great intercessor before God, so that the memory of the Pope of the family would lead couples and families to fervent prayer through his intercession. We would like to express our special gratitude to Archbishop Wacław Depo, Metropolitan of Częstochowa. The relics of

St. John Paul II are his personal gift. We must ask the Holy Spirit through the intercession of the Blessed Mother and St. John Paul II, whose relics we have on the altar, so that we can remain faithful to the grace of our vocations – emphasized the Metropolitan of Częstochowa in his homily. He also recalled the importance of trusting in God and fulfilling the call of Mary of Fatima who encouraged to pray, penance and conversion: "Meditate the Word of God, strengthen your relationship with Christ in the Sacrament of Penance and the Eucharist. Explore the problems of interior life and apostolate towards others in order to justify the hope that is in you and that is of God" – these obliging words of the Polish Pope which he left to the faithful as a task. Who is John Paul II for us today? Above all, he is a saint, our spiritual Father and the greatest moral authority. For us personally, we recognize as a gift from God that we had a chance to meet St. John Paul a few times. The first time in the Vatican, more than 30 years ago, when the Pope laid his own hand on our joined hands and blessed our marriage. We had a few other meetings and our farewell meeting was the funeral of the Pope on April 8, 2005. After the departure of St. John Paul to the Father's House, we were left with meetings and prayers at His Tomb in St. Peter's Basilica. Our last meeting of this kind took place during the Eu-

charist in the Vatican on October 9th. Today, we feel happy that the Lord has put St. John Paul II on our path. Meetings with our Pope have had a huge impact on our personal, married and family life. Seeing how much has been given to us, we want to continue on the path of the Holy Father, John Paul II. We feel obliged and responsible for the memory of him and his pastoral teaching, especially about the family. What the Polish Pope wrote exactly 40 years ago about the family in *Familiaris consortio*, later in the Letter to Families or in *Evangelium Vitae* is still so relevant. It is applicable to the Polish and European reality and should be constantly reminded. We would like to realize this goal in our John Paul II Foundation Chapter starting from the day of the introduction of the relics of St. Pope to our parish. Fr. Piotr Hernoga, Pa-





stor of the St. Mary Magdalene Parish would take care of the pastoral matters related to our Chapter and faithful from other Radomsko parishes are our Chapter's members. We would very

much like the members of the Chapter, realizing the words of St. John Paul II stated in the New Millennium Ineunte – the primacy of grace over action – first of all put emphasize on their pray-

ers and then realize various pastoral and evangelizing projects. Let us love and imitate St. John Paul II even more.

## 17TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE HOLY FATHER JOHN PAUL II DEPARTURE TO THE HOUSE OF THE FATHER

On April 2, 2005 at 9:37 p.m., the beloved John Paul II went to the Father's House. Seventeen years later, as every year on that day, at the relics of St. John Paul II in St. Peter's Basilica, the Holy Mass was

celebrated. Today's Holy Mass at 8.30 am was celebrated by Fr Piotr Bajor from the Congregation for Catholic Education in the Vatican, with the participation of the Ambassador of the Republic of Poland to the Holy

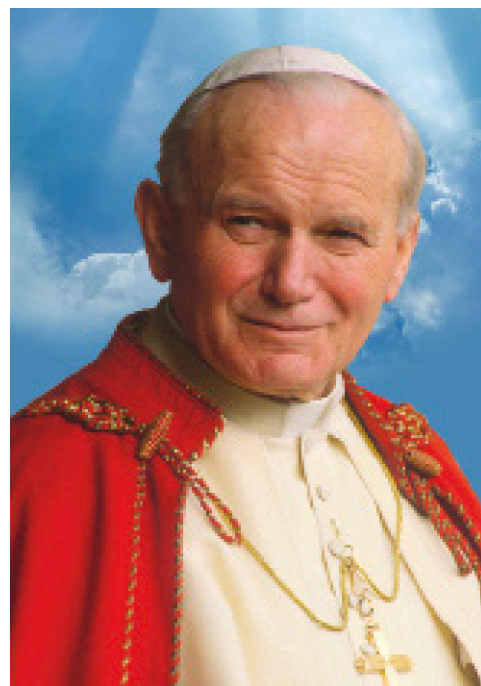
See and numerous believers. The text of the homily: Until October 16, 1978, Poland, our Homeland, from this place: Rome and the Vatican was perceived as a distant country. The day of the election of a Pole to



the See of Peter changed a lot. The pontificate of John Paul made this distant country close, not only close to Italy and the West, but above all liberated Poland from the yoke of evil that distanced us from the civilized world, suppressing values, freedom and democracy. For almost 27 years of his pontificate, the history of our homeland – for the evident cause of the Pope from Poland – has experienced dynamic changes of historical significance. Hence, 2 April 2005 seemed to be the moment when this influence of John Paul would be closed; just as the book of the Evangelist was closed on the coffin of the saint on the day of his funeral. Nothing could be further from the truth! The unforgettable Saturday of the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday gave us all the strength and the right to say – albeit in sorrow – with deep conviction and responsibility: He was truly holy – of us and among us! At that time we had such an unshakable conviction, regardless of whether someone was close to Him here in the Vatican, or only from a distance – already close to Poland at that time – he was looking at this man; we had a sincere and authentic conviction: He was a holy man! It was a natural reaction after the end of his earthly life, after his death. Hence, it is now difficult to believe and give credence to contemporary pseudo-witnesses

who try to ridicule His holiness, who ooze a narrative poisoned by falsehood and manipulation, or even accuse His indisputable authority; who want to find compromising facts of His life, which in the end only discredits them. Today, on the 17th anniversary of the passage from this world to the house of the Holy Father John Paul, we stand at his tomb, at the Eucharistic altar, to give thanks precisely for this Pontificate, for this holy Pope, for bringing Poland closer to the world, for the fact that we no longer speak – in any aspect – about Poland, as a distant country from Rome, Europe, from the values that this place gave and brought to the world. So what message is coming from this place today? Let us at first look at the Liturgy of the Word. St. John the Evangelist describes a scene in which he shows the reaction of the crowd to the person of Jesus. Some say of Him: “This one is truly a prophet”, others “This is the Messiah”. But there are other voices: “Will the Messiah come from Galilee?” Various opinions about Jesus. Therefore, in the crowd there was a split because of Him. On the one hand, doubts and disbelief arose, and on the other hand, the person of Jesus gave rise to credibility, delight and admiration: “Never before has anyone spoken like this man”. Let us return, then, to the message

from April 2, 2005. It wasn't the day when it all ended! On the contrary, on that day everything changed and took on a different, much deeper meaning. If from that day we have an Advocate in Heaven, who is so close to us, who, living on earth, made a distant country in the geopolitical system of that time close by opening the door to Christ without fear; how can we fail to believe that the areas now marked and occupied by evil, sin, war, injustice cannot become close to God precisely because of Him who was born for Heaven on April 2, 2005.



## CHRISTMAS WAFER AT THE JOHN PAUL II FOUNDATION'S HOME

The most beautiful supper of the year is Christmas Eve Supper. The glow of the Christmas tree, the table covered with a white tablecloth and the wafer create an unusual, festive atmosphere. On Saturday, December 11, 2021, at the John Paul II Foundation Home in Lublin, a Christmas meeting was held. At 6

p.m. the Holy Mass began celebrated by Fr. Robert Ptak. In his sermon he referred to the symbolism of bread and its meaning both in everyday life and in the Eucharist celebrated and the tradition of breaking the Christmas wafers. Quoting the words of St. Brother Albert, he encouraged the audience to be as good as the

bread that lies on the table and everyone can cut even a piece for themselves and feed on it. In such an important and special time of Advent, therefore, we should be kind to others, pray more and sincerely believe in the miracle of God's light, which the newborn Son of God will soon bring us. ## PEREGRINATION OF THE JOHN PAUL II FOUNDATION'S TRIPTYCH

The peregrination of the Triptych commemorating the 100th anniversary of the birth of our Great Compatriot, St. John Paul II began on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 11, 2021 and is still continuing in the year 2022. Members of the John Paul II Foundation New York Chapter were direct witnesses of the dedication of the Triptych. The triptych was blessed by Bishop Witold Mroziowski during a special Holy Mass celebrated in the Church of the Holy Cross in Maspeth, Queens. In each parish, the visitation of Triptych last for nine days, during which the novena to St. John Paul II is prayed. On this occasion, a special prayer book was issued and distributed by members of the board of the New York Chapter. The triptych commemorating the 100th anniversary of St. John Paul II birth began the peregrination in the Church of the Holy Cross in Maspeth. On Sunday, April 25,

2021, it was exhibited at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Manhattan during a Mass commemorating the seventh anniversary of the canonization of St. John Paul II. It was then transferred to the Polish-American parish of St. Matthias in Ridgewood, Queens. During the following months, the Triptych visited the following Polish parishes in Brooklyn: Our Lady of Czestochowa, St. Casimir, St. Rose of Lima and the parish of St. Francis de Chantal. The Triptych also visited Greenpoint in Polish parishes: St. Stanislaus Kostka and Saints Cyril and Methodius. The American parishes of Our Lady of Hope in Middle Village and the Guardian of Angel in Brooklyn also prayed in front of the Triptych. Bishop Witold Mroziowski is the coordinator of the Triptych peregrination in the parishes. The founder of the Triptych is Dariusz Knapik, a long-time member of the New York Foundation Chapter, who

together with a group of friends and employees of his own construction company Victoria Consulting & Development LLC, selflessly made the Triptych and gave it to the faithful. The author of the paintings painted on linden boards is Polish artist Bogusław Onsowicz. The gilded, decorative frames were designed and made by carpenter Mariusz Kusztykiewicz. "The Triptych is a gift that comes from my heart, but also from other hearts, those who participated in its creation," said the founder. May 18, 2020 marked the 100th anniversary of the birth of St. John Paul II and anniversary celebrations were prepared for that year. Due to the COVID-19 epidemic announced at the beginning of March 2020, the celebrations and peregrination of the Triptych were postponed to 2021 and 2022.

On the initiative of the John Paul II Foundation and the Poland in the Heart Association, the X edition of the Wolf's Trail Run, was held for the first time also in Rome, at the Polish House at Via Cassia 1200. The event, which took place on March 6, 2022, began with a solemn Holy Mass in the intention of the Homeland and peace in the world. The Holy Mass was celebrated by the Administrator of the John Paul II Foundation, Father Dr. Krzysztof Wieliczko. In addition to the numerous faithful who gathered for the Mass, the Ambassador of the Republic of Poland to the Holy See, Mr. Janusz Kotański, and the Head of the Consular Department of the Polish Embassy in Rome, Mrs. Agata Ibek – Wojtasik, also honored with their presence. brought the participation of children and youth from Polish Schools. After the Holy Mass, there was a patriotic verbal and musical program performed by Roman, Polish diaspora artists and school youth. Then, the Wolf Trail Run took place. Polonia in Rome ran a symbolic 1963 meters in

From March 2, numerous and generous gifts were sent to the Polish Home at Via Cassia 1200 for all those who were forced to flee immediately by the war in Ukraine. ## LET US LOVE NOT WITH WORDS, BUT WITH DEEDS (CF. 1 JN 3:18) – SOLIDARITY WITH UKRAINE

For 11 days, the whole world has been watching with horror the nightmare of the war in Ukraine. Every day, day and night, the bombing of Ukrainian towns continues. There are thousands wounded and killed, including civilians and children. There is an exodus of people from Ukraine. More than a million people have already escaped to Poland alone, of which 2/3 are women, children and young people. The world stands in solidarity with Ukraine, providing it with much assistance. The war also affected people who live in our Foundation Home, especially those from Ukraine. However, regardless of the country of origin, we are all united and stand in solidarity with Ukraine in many different ways. First of all, we pray for peace and cessation of hostilities in our eastern neighbor. We also pray for the miracle of conversion for the aggressors, especially for Vladimir

Putin and his henchmen. Last week, after a long period of time related to the coronavirus epidemic, it was possible to organize a retreat in the monastery of the Sacred Heart Fathers in Pliszczyna. The youth were very happy about this. They participated in the daily Eucharist and adoration, listened to the conference and went to confession. In the current situation the integration meetings that take place in the hall of our Home play a very important role. It is an excellent opportunity to exchange opinions, strengthen hope, and awareness that we are creating one family of people who are co-responsible for each other. We are also taking concrete actions. In our Home we hosted the families of our scholarship recipients for a few days. Currently, we are hosting several people who will be staying with us for longer period of time. Our young people are involved in

helping as volunteers in Caritas or other charitable institutions. Scholarship recipients are helping arriving refugees at the bus and railway stations, segregate gifts and organize time for children coming to Lublin from the war zones. The last initiative is the purchase of Easter lambs. Caritas Poland distributes Easter lambs in parishes and we are also distributing them at the Foundation Home. The proceeds from the sale is intended to help Ukraine. Scholarship recipients are also buying the lambs even though they have modest funds, but they want to help Ukraine. In addition to prayer, this is a very important dimension of solidarity with the Ukrainian people. We thank all the benefactors for their prayers and concrete actions of kindness and support.
